Larne Music Festival - Child Protection Policy: Code of Practice

Although members of the Executive Committee of Larne Music Festival Association, and volunteers selected by that Committee, play a secondary role to that of accompanying school staff, parents or guardians of children taking part in the Festival, this Code of Practice is drawn up to enable members of the Executive Committee and official volunteers to fulfil their duties and:

- Ensure the well-being of children by providing a safe environment during the Festival. It
 must be stressed that responsibility for children under 18 years of age and vulnerable
 adults (those with learning difficulties) rests with parents, guardians, carers, teachers –
 not with Festival staff
- To set out appropriate response and procedures to deal with disclosure or discovery of child abuse during Larne Music Festival
- To safeguard those who come into contact with children during Larne Music Festival from the consequences of unfounded accusations

Members of the Executive Committee of Larne Music Festival Association and appointed volunteers:

- 1. Shall report to the Chairman of Executive Committee any suspicion or misgivings he/she may have concerning inappropriate behaviour or circumstances affecting children and must co-operate in reporting the details to the appropriate civil agencies. This will be done via a written record of aforesaid inappropriate behaviour.
- 2. Should ensure that there are at least two adults present with a group or with a child
- 3. The Executive Committee does not accept responsibility for instruments, personal belongings/money
- 4. The Executive Committee bans the taking of photographs and videos during the Festival. Photographs may be taken by local press only, provided they have obtained permission from those with parental responsibility.
